TERMS OF ADMISSION.

Candidates for admission into the Freshman Class are required to write Latin grammatically, and to be well versed in Geography, Arithmetic, Cicero's Select Orations, the Bucolics, Georgics, and Aeneid of Virgil, Sallust, the Gospels of the Greek Testament, and Jacob's Greek reader. They must produce certificates of their good moral character. The usual time for examination is the Friday after Commencement.—Candidates for admission into the other classes will be examined also in the books, which have been studied by the class, into which admission is requested.—Scholars from other Colleges, before they can be examined, must produce a certificate of their regular dismission. The Geography to be studied may be Morse's, Worcester's, or Cummings'.

COURSE OF STUDY.

FRESHMAN CLASS.

First Term. Græca Majora (extracts from Xenophon's Anabasis and Herodotus); Livy (2 books); Lacroix's Arithmetic and Euler's Algebra.

Second Term. Græca Majora (extracts from Thucydides and Homer); Livy finished (5 books); Lacroix's Algebra.

Third Term. Græca Majora (Homer, Isocrates & Xenophon's Memorabilia); Excerpta Latina (extracts from Patriculus and Pliny's Letters); Murray's English Grammar; Lacroix's Algebra finished.

SOPHOMORE CLASS.

First Term. Græca Majora (extracts from Theophrastus, Polyænus and Plato); Excerpta Latina (Tacitus); Blair's Rhetoric; Cambridge Mathematics (Plane Trigonometry); Legendre's Geometry.

Second Term. Græca Majora; (Lysias, Demosthenes, and Dionysius Halicarn); Excerpta Latina; Cam. Mathematics (Heights and Distances, Navigation, and Surveying); Geometry finished; Hedge's Logic.

Third Term. Græca Majora; (Hesiod &c.); Excerpta Latina; Cambridge Mathematics.

JUNIOR CLASS.

First Term. Græca Majora; Excerpta Latina; Cam. Mathematics; Enfield's Natural Philosophy; French.

Second Term. Græca Majora; Horace; Enfield's Natural Philosophy; Locke's Essay; French.

Third Term. Priestley's Lectures on History; Græca Majora; Horace; Locke's Essay.

SENIOR CLASS.

First Term. Astronomy and Mathematics; Paley's Natural Theology; Stewart's Philosophy of the Mind, (vol. i.); Paley's Evidences.

Second Term. Chemistry; Stewart's Philosophy of the Mind, (vol. ii.); Burlemaqui on Natural Law; Butler's Analogy.

Third Term. Natural History; Cleaveland's Mineralogy; Butler's Analogy.

EXERCISES DURING THE YEAR.

Private Declamations of each Class, and public Declamations of the three upper Classes.

Compositions in English of the two upper Classes.

Forensic Disputations of the Seniors.

Translations into Latin and Greek by the two lower Classes.

Translations into English by the Sophomore class.

Recitations in the Bible every Sunday evening.

Two weeks preceding the term Examinations are spent in review of the studies of the term.

LECTURES.

On Chemistry, delivered during the second term to the Junior and Senior Classes.

On Natural Philosophy, delivered during the third term to the Junior and Senior Classes.

On Mineralogy, delivered to the Senior Class during the third term.

On Rhetoric and Oratory, delivered to the Senior Class once each fortnight during the year.

The principal annual expenses are for tuition, \$24,00 ; and for room rent \$10,00. Board may be had for \$1,50 a week.

Medical School of Maine.

The Medical School was established by an Act of the Legislature, passed June 27th, 1820. It is under the direction of the Boards of Trustees and Overseers of Bowdoin College, and receives from the State \$1,000 a year for the purpose of making additions to the Library, Cabinet, and Apparatus.—The Medical Lectures commence, annually, about the middle of *February*; and continue three months. The fees of admission to all the Lectures are fifty dollars.

Candidates for the degree of Doctor of Medicine are examined by the Faculty of Medicine at the termination of each course of Lectures. They must have devoted three years to professional studies, under the direction of a regular practitioner of medicine, and must have attended two full courses of Lectures, the last of which must have been at this Institution. They must pass a satisfactory examination in Anatomy, Physiology, Chemistry; *Materia Medica*, Pharmacy, Midwifery, Surgery and the Theory and Practice of Physic; and must publicly read and defend a Dissertation on some Medical Subject. Those candidates, who have not received a collegial education, must satisfy the Faculty of their proficiency in the Latin Language and in Natural Philosophy.

Students are allowed free access to the Library, which contains about 1,800 vols. principally modern works, which have been selected with much care. The Library also contains an extensive and valuable collection of Plates, among which are the splendid works of Albinus,—Vicq D'Azyr,—Cloquet,—Home,—Scarpa,—Cooper,—the Bells,—Baillie,—Bateman, &c. Many recent and approved works have been added since the last course of Lectures.

The Anatomical Cabinet, which was received from Europe, and formed in part the private cabinet of the late Prof. Thillaye, of Paris, contains all the preparations, which will be found necessary for demonstrations, and embraces many valuable specimens in Morbid and Comparative Anatomy.

The Chemical and Philosophical apparatus is ample, and furnishes means for full courses of Lectures on these subjects.
